Howdy to all my old friends and my new friends to be. We soon will be restarting a new season at SBCC and with the new season comes new ideas and some changes.

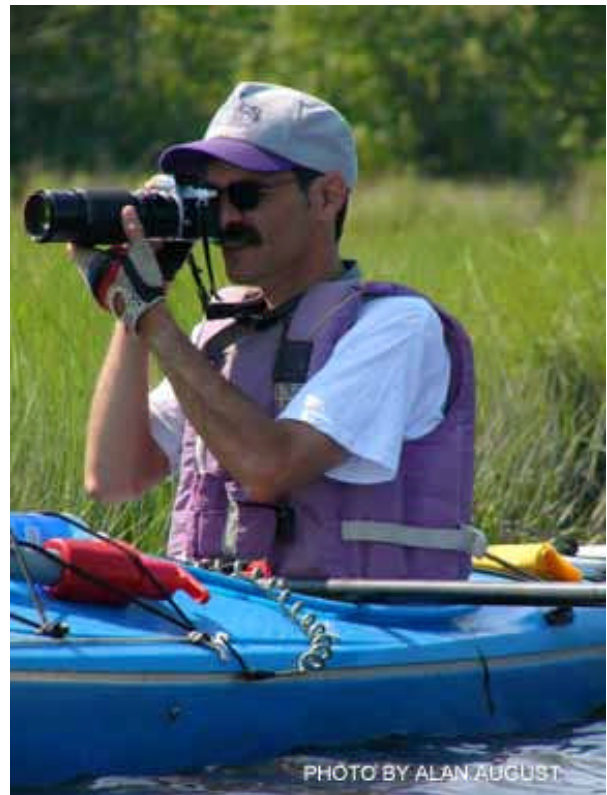
The biggest change you will notice is the split format of competition nights and the addition of digital nature & creative categories. It became too much to handle last year's classes & categories in one night, so we have decided to try a random rotation of categories over nine meetings instead of five meetings. We believe, this will relieve the stress of time & space constraints and allow more time for judge's comments.

The second change I hope we can accomplish is the creation of better communications between SBCC and the membership, and between members themselves. A member's manual has been proposed with all the information needed for full participation and understanding about how SBCC works.

I would like to advocate a return to the use of name badges. SBCC is growing with many new members. So, to help us "old timers" and "newbies" get to know one another we will update the rack of name badges and members should wear them. Please replace them in the rack at the end of meetings, so no excuses of, "I forgot it at home."

Another possible aid to communication among members would be a mentor list. Let's say you just changed camera systems, like I did this past year. I switched to a Canon EOS 3, and I'm having problems trying to figure out how to get something to work. I could scan the mentor list, looking for others in SBCC who also use an EOS 3 camera: then I could contact them and ask them for help.

Some things are not about to change. SBCC will continue to interact with other clubs, YPA, NECCC & PSA. The meetings will continue to be informative and educational yet friendly and fun. Image Study Night will still provide members a vehicle to show work and test their creativity. More open and honest comments from the members



would be a great benefit to those testing images for competition.

I am very excited to be taking on these new responsibilities as President of SBCC. I feel if we all work together toward our common goals, we can effect positive & constructive changes to better an already suburb camera club.

On a personal note, with the gracious help of a good friend, I was able to "test the waters" of kayaking this summer (no pun intended). **STONY BROOK CAMERA CLUB**

**PURPOSE:** To promote enjoyment and proficiency in all aspects of photography through education by mutual exchange of knowledge and experience; and, to promote a broad appreciation of our environment.

**MEETINGS:** Meetings will be held every Thursday of each month; no meetings in July and August. Consult the SBCC Calendar of Events. All meetings start at 7:30 P.M. The regular meeting place is Stony Brook Audubon Preserve, Norfolk, MA off Route 115. At other times activities are scheduled in other nearby locations.

**DUES:** Individuals: \$30.00, Families: \$40.00, and \$15.00 for students and members over 65 years of age. To be eligible for competitions, dues must be paid by the first competition.

**NEWSLETTER:** Published six times during the year for Aug/Sept, Oct/Nov, Dec/Jan, Feb/Mar, Apr/May, and Jun/Jul and solely for the information, guidance and enjoyment of the Stony Brook Camera Club, Norfolk, MA

**OFFICERS:** Elected annually and serve as the executive committee with two past presidents. The Stony Brook Camera Club is affiliated with the New England Camera Club Council and is a member of the Photographic Society of America

**Competitions for the 2005-2006 season**

Recently a meeting was held between the club's executive committee and the competition committees for the purpose of reviewing the current competition practices. The competitions are so popular that they have created a number of issues that need to be addressed. These are:

- The large attendance at competitions
- The large quantity of slides, prints and digital images that are submitted (over 200 per competition)
- Length of the meetings
- The limited categories that receive judges' comments.

All these issues are the result of the club's growing membership and popularity. They would be welcomed by most other clubs because these clubs are seeing declining memberships while Stony Brook is enjoying a thriving and growing enrollment.

Stony Brook Camera Club is extraordinarily successful and the committees are very reluctant to change any of the club's practices or policies. The competitions represent a great opportunity to learn from the judges' comments and suggestions; however the large number of entries has limited this commentary and feedback. The main focus of our camera club is to provide a learning environment to all members, and the current competition arrangement has severely reduced that opportunity. The new arrangement developed by the committees represents a corporative effort to return to a more educational and learning competition format. The new approach presented below is a serious attempt to correct the existing problems and restore a more fruitful experience to the competitions.

- There will be 9 competition nights.
- Each competition night will host a subset of the competition categories. For example, the first competition night may not include prints or digital 'Open' categories.
- Each competition category will occur 4 times during the year (2 less than last year)
- Each member can submit 2 images per category per competition for which they are eligible.
- Members are allowed to makeup 2 images in each category.
- Scoring will remain a 15 point system.

These changes are expected to reduce the total number of slides and images to around 125 for each competition. This is a drastic reduction from the average of around 205 received during last year's competition nights. The reduction in entries will allow the judge to comment on most (if not all) of the images.

We are hopeful this program and policy change will have a positive impact on the learning experience for club members. Your feedback and suggestions are always welcome.

The New England Camera Club Council, with great pride and gratitude, dedicates its 60<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference to **Robert C. Yankee, HonNEC**, of Franklin, MA, for his long and dedicated service to NECCC and his contributions to the photographic community at large.

Bob has served on the Council since 1976. He was Conference Equipment Director for an eight year period which saw a major expansion of the size and scope of the Annual Conference. Bob later served an extended term as President of the Council (1985-1988). He has since served as Chairman of the Board, and Chairman of the Steering Committee. Bob's knowledge, and leadership skills, along with a highly developed sense of humor have gained him the respect of all.

In recognition of his teaching and encouraging young people to pursue photography, and of his service to the Council, Bob received the honor of Master Member (MNEC) in 1981, and in 1988 was awarded the high honor of Honorary Member (HonHEC).
