#### Letter from the President by Rosemarie Marsh

It is cold, really cold, but have you noticed the days are getting longer? Not by much, but by enough to realize winter is making its' way toward spring. Slowly, ever so slightly, it is a reliable progression felt in familiar nuances by those of us who winter here. It is obviously still deep winter, too soon to look different, yet by paying attention it is clear that something is changing.

There is an unfolding journey that is part of photography too, one that comes to light in the rich context of Stony Brook Camera Club. A love of photography, of taking pictures is the obvious beginning. Like the winter around me, I feel like something is changing. Not yet visible, hard to explain, but changing. I have become increasingly aware of the subtle shift from my loving photography to being a photographer. I mean this in the most humble and ordinary sense of the statement; I am a photographer. It is a shift of ownership and identity, a movement from what I like, to who I am. Slowly, ever so slightly I am coming to understand the nuances of what this means.

Photography allows us to bridge to the world and express what we experience in remarkably personal ways. It allows us to capture and share something beyond what is seen. Something felt or imagined perhaps. It uses so much of who we are, what we experience, and what we know. It is highly technical and deeply creative. There is the part that is in us, the part that is of the world, and the part that is simply the tool. To be a photographer means bringing your inner world and your technical skill

together to express a moment, an idea, a thought, an experience in an image that captures the imagination; the inner world of the viewer. It also means recognizing when an image you see contains something of the maker. When I view other photographer's work I am transfixed. When an image communicates, I have no choice but to notice. When I hold my camera, when I feel the familiar weight of it in my hand I am overcome with a sense of calm. Not obvious, but there as clearly as the lengthening days.

We all come to camera club with a love of photography and gifts to share. It is up to us to explore what we have and what we need. If you bring technical strengths, are you learning as others share their creativity? If your strength is creativity are you learning from others technical expertise? I think we are all elevated by stretching beyond what comes easily and welcoming what others have to offer. Recent presentations gave us such an opportunity. Tony asked us to view work of the masters and stretch beyond the boundaries of what we ordinarily view. Ray asked us to consider how we respond to color as we make creative decisions. How can we help but grow if we stay open to all we have here?

Are you nurturing your ability to see creatively and are you building technical skills? Are you bringing those together in ways that please you? Are you stretching beyond what comes easily? Are you exposing yourself to beauty, creativity, art, music, and nature? Are you getting what you can and what you need from your club experience? It can be a satisfying journey, a reliable progression of change with wonderful company along the way.


