# Letter from the President By Rosemarie Marsh

"You did then what you knew how to do. And when you knew better, you did better". Maya Angelou. Such a simple statement yet so vast, richly textured, and encompassing. I linger over these words and for me they speak eloquently of learning and growth, hope and potential. These words have led me to better understand myself as a learner, explore my contexts for learning, and meet my responsibilities in the learning process. I think about the camera club experience we share and the desire to improve our craft; the process of growing as a photographer. How do you explore the process and answer the questions for yourself?

The learner. What kind of learner are you? Do you know? Are you patient or easily frustrated? Do you celebrate progress or demand perfection? Are you willing to build on your strengths and strengthen your weaknesses? Do you seek feedback or defend against it? Are you goal directed with a mental image of your desired photograph or curious and moving step by step through each curiosity to some surprise end? Do you do best with abstracts? Books, information, collecting data that you will remember and put together in some uniquely personal way? Do you do best with a hands on approach? Camera in hand and mentor by your side? Or alone and making attempts with errors and successes as your best guide, shaping your progress by trial and feedback? Is your ideal process shared with others or intensely personal? Driven by information, privately inspired, or guided by curiosity? Do you learn best by teaching and helping others? Where do you find satisfaction? Is it about art or science, process or result? Some blending of these? Do you have other questions to ponder? Do you know yourself as a learner?

The context. If you have a sense of who you are as a learner, you have the beginnings of what serves you

best for a learning context. The club is one place where we find or create opportunities to learn. Presentations by club members who can share what they know are a uniquely wonderful resource. Outside photographers who can inspire, and if we are truly lucky, challenge and stretch our understanding of photography can move us forward. Image study where we can bring our questions, our errors, our successes and seek a greater foundation for who we are as artists and as technicians. Competitions where we can challenge ourselves, share our best attempts, and build recognition for our accomplishments. Camera club provides amazing opportunities, but there is more. Within and beyond club, what meets your learning needs?

The bridge. What do you do? I think this is the place of action and I believe we all have such responsibility here; to ourselves and to one another. What do you do with the learning opportunities available to you? How do you take knowing yourself as a learner and cultivate your own best learning environment? How do you stay responsible for keeping the shared resource of club rich for everyone? Do you attend club meetings? Are you attending meetings that confirm your strengths, or are you stretching your boundaries? Do you share what you know? Do you ask for help? Do you invest in keeping a vibrant and safe place to take risks and get feedback? Do you go on field trips, attend community events, chase the light and subjects you seek? Do you take formal classes? Do you walk through nature? Gardens? Cities? What do you look at, what do you allow and even challenge yourself to see? Do you read books? Visit on line tutorials? Visit galleries? Museums? Spend time with your camera and create images? Does non-visual experience nurture your process? Music? Activities? Community? Solitude? How do you bridge Quiet? learner and learning environment for you?
