
-Open lightroom

-Open folder with the images you want to use

-Open the "print" module from the menu in the top right



Lightroom comes with templates.

-On the left side, open the "Template Browser"-click on the arrow so it points down

-Click on the arrow next to "Lightroom Templates" and scroll to the bottom to find "Triptych" and click on it

This Template should open. It probably looks something like this.



You should now have a horizontal diptych to add your images to.

By changing the left and right margins, the cell spacing, and the cell size, you can change the size of the layout boxes to accommodate your vertical images.

All the changes you will need are in the "Layout" panel. By changing the "Columns" this will make as many boxes as you want.

Adding the photos

Make sure you can see your toolbar at the bottom of the template. If not, hit the "t" key. Now make sure "Use Selected Photos" is on.



Now just click on your images in the filmstrip along the bottom of the page and the images will appear in the boxes.

You must click on two images for them to fill both boxes. (Hold down the crtl key as you select the images)

Click on the image in the box and adjust its contents to where you want it.

If "zoom to fill" is checked in the "Image Settings" it will automatically fill the box. You also have the choice of checking the box "Rotate to Fill" is you need to rotate the image.

NOTE: Lightroom automatically adds the selected photos in the order that they appear in the filmstrip. Click on the image in the filmstrip and drag it to change the order.

If you need to start over, just choose the new images and they will be populated in the template in place of the older ones.

To clear the template of all images, make sure you do not have any images selected.

Saving your file

Next go to the "Print Job" section on the right at the bottom and make sure "Print to" says JPEG File.

Output to JPEG File

The settings in the Print Job panel change when you set **Print to** to JPEG File. Figure 5.42 shows what you need to know about creating JPEG files in the Print module.

When you are done creating your diptych, click on the "Print to File" button in the lower right and a "Save File" box will open. Select where you want to save this final image, fill in file name, and click "Save".
